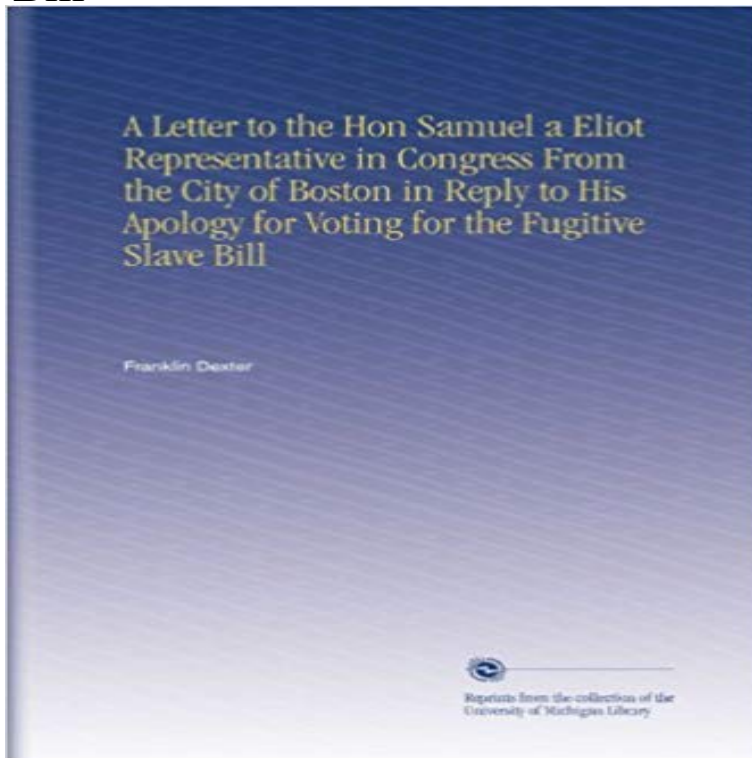


A Letter to the Hon Samuel a Eliot Representative in Congress From the City of Boston in Reply to His Apology for Voting for the Fugitive Slave Bill
