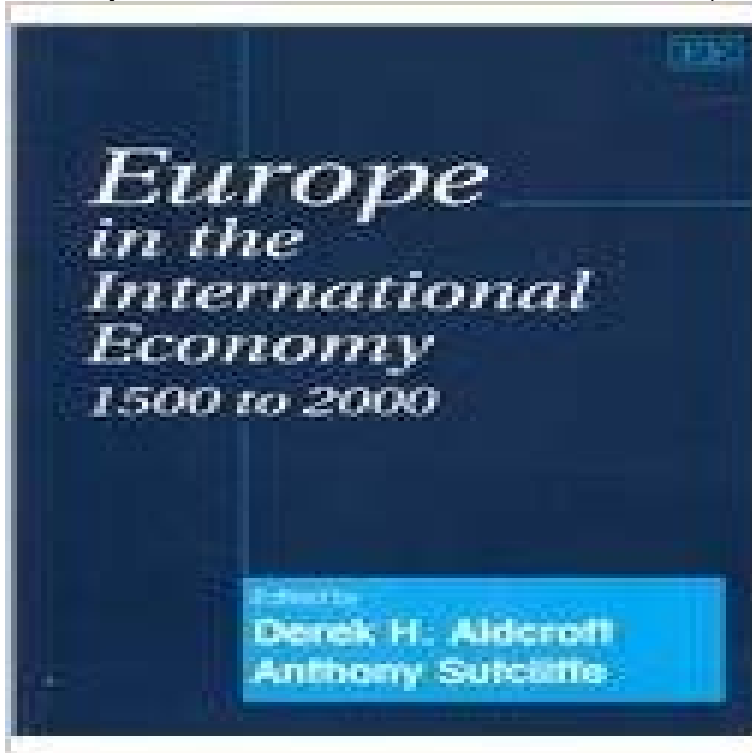


Europe in the International Economy 1500 to 2000
