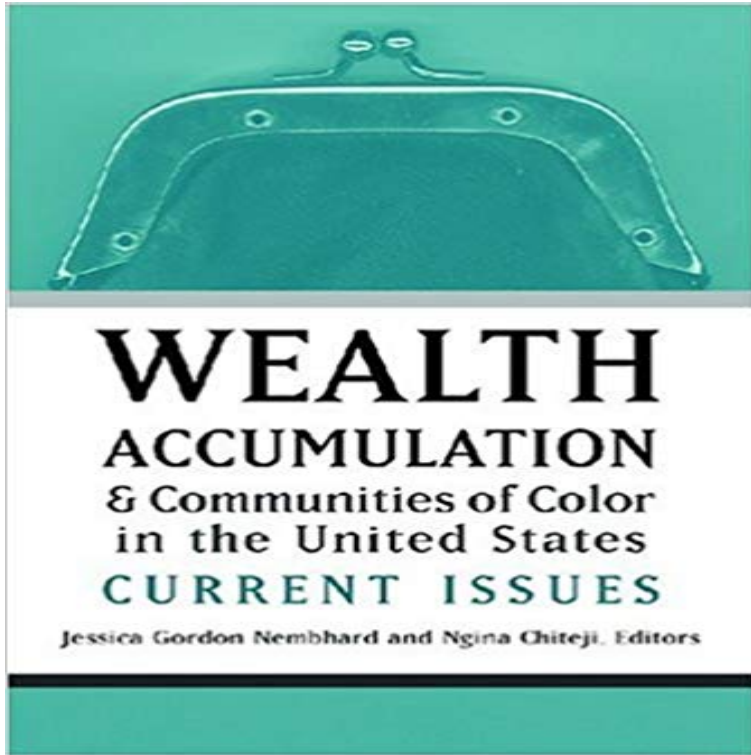


Wealth Accumulation and Communities of Color in the United States: Current Issues
